Design a brand-new all-through School Inspiring Futures through Learning (IFTL) Trust Glebe Farm Competition

ARE YOU CREATIVE, GROUNDBREAKING AND IMAGINATIVE? Are you aspiring to be an artist, architect, a designer? If so, this competition is for you.

Excitingly, as you may well have heard, IFTL (working closely with 5 Dimensions) have been selected to run the new all-through school in South-East Milton Keynes and will cater for children from Reception through to Year 11 under one roof! The school will open from September 2022 and will provide places for up to 1,530 children. It will include sports facilities, such as an artificial grass pitch, plus provision for a 39-place full-time equivalent (FTE) nursery.

If you enjoy a project and want to be part of the build and creation of our new school, then this competition is for you. We would very much like to see your ideas about what an exciting, friendly, dynamic new school should look and feel like for learners in 2022 and beyond!

You can design a classroom, the entrance hall, outdoor areas, one wall, part of the building, smaller areas or the whole thing.



AGE RANGES

There will be three key age ranges:

- Years one to three
- Years four to seven
- Years eight to eleven



All three winning designs, for each age range, will be displayed in frames in the school entrance with a plaque of the winner's names.

They will also be used by the designers and therefore may be seen in the building itself!

PRIZES

First prize for each age range: invitation to spend a day at the school which will include the opening ceremony and celebration tea with Sarah Bennett, the CEO of the Trust, Glen Martin, the CEO of five dimensions, and the new leaders of the school. Each winner will also win a £50 amazon voucher.

Second prize winners: invitation to the opening ceremony and £30 amazon voucher.

Third prize winners: they will be invited to the opening ceremony and win a £20 amazon voucher.

This competition is open to all pupils of Inspiring Futures through Learning (IFTL) and 5 Dimensions schools and their siblings aged between five and sixteen (inclusive) attending those schools during April 2020.

Details of the building to help your design:

The school building will provide accommodation for up to 1530 pupils. The primary phase will have three forms (classes) of entry and will cater for 90 pupils in each year from Year R to Year 6. The secondary phase will have capacity for six forms of entry and will cater for 180 pupils from Year 7 to Year 11. There will also be provision for a 39 place FTE nursery. There is no post 16 accommodation proposed on the site. There will be an Artificial Grass Pitch which will also become an essential part of local community leisure facilities.

The Glebe Farm Site Development:



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The School building and grounds Within your design, think about:

- What will you name the school and why (if applicable to your design)?
- What will the school grounds look like? Remember it needs to include an artificial grass pitch, some outdoor learning areas, play equipment and so on.
- What will the front entrance into the school look like? Think about the first impression you want to make as everyone first enters the school.
- What will the building layout be? Think about where the hall will be, music and performing arts studio, sports hall, library, science laboratories and so on.
- Will it be over two or three floors and how will this influence the layout of the school?
- Will the learners at Glebe Farm have different areas of the school depending on their age? What will be available to the different age ranges and why? How many playgrounds/ communal areas will there be and for which age groups? Remember we will need outdoor learning areas for our nursery, reception and year one children.
- What will our school have that is unique and special?
- Will our school have any environmentally friendly aspects? How will learners use these?
- Think about: the layout, materials, practical aspects like lighting and quirky design features.

Cross-curricular links

This competition encourages the exploration of some cross-curricular areas as follows:

Science: what materials could be used for different parts of the buildings and school grounds? Why? What plants and trees could be used and what will they 'look like' at different times of the year?

Art: displaying your artist ideas through drawings, paintings and design techniques.

Design and Technology: build and apply knowledge to design high-quality models. What will your design look like? How will you show the different parts of the building?

Geography: what are the local features of the environment and community? How will the design link to the local community and how will it promote their facilities? How will the design compare to buildings locally? Will this be in a similar style or dramatically different?

History: What is the history of the local area? Could any of these be featured in your design?

PE: How are you going to support healthy living including opportunities for all the learners to exercise? What facilities do we need including for competitive sports? How will these be included in the design?

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Terms and Conditions

9. Winners will need to provide a photo to be published alongside their entry which may be used for any marketing and publicity purposes across IFtL and 5 Dimensions including but not limited to social media, website and media (such as the local or national press).
10. If you are selected as a finalist, the entrant (or the parent/carer if the entrant is under the age of 13) is required to complete a 'permission to publish form' and a 'parental consent form' for under 13's for us to gain consent for the winner's details to be published.
11. Any personal data relating to the winner or any other entrants will be used solely in accordance with current UK data protection legislation and will not be disclosed to a third party without the entrant's parents/carer written consent.
